The Palm Beaches boast 47 miles of beaches, vast natural areas, alfresco fine dining, world class golf courses and luxurious spas.

Stunning resort and hotel properties offer nothing but memorable experiences to all those seeking a sunny escape. As America's First Resort Destination[®] you'll find premier four- and five-star resorts where fine beaches, elegant pools, lavish spas and gourmet dining are just the beginning of the guest experience.

Sun-kissed sands stretch from Jupiter to Boca Raton, ensuring you'll find just the right beach to match your personality. As the closest spot in North America to the clear, Gulf Stream waters, The Palm Beaches attract sea turtles, tropical fish, sailfish, goliath grouper and dolphins. Divers and snorkelers can explore more than 160+ artificial reefs and an abundance of deep-water wrecks.

The Palm Beaches are Florida's Cultural Capital[®], home to more than 200 art, entertainment and historical venues. Explore The Flagler Museum, highlighting art from America's Gilded Age, and the Norton Museum of Art, housing over 7,000 U.S. and international works, or stroll outdoors at Morikami Museum & Japanese Gardens specializing in bonsai displays and the Ann Norton Sculpture Gardens.

An abundance of outdoor shopping venues await, including the Palm Beach Outlets, Royal Poinciana Plaza, and four traditional indoor shopping malls. World-renowned Worth Avenue spans three blocks from the Atlantic Ocean to the Intracoastal Waterway. Antique Row is a charming shopping district in West Palm Beach with more than 40 antique stores.

The Palm Beaches are Florida's Golf Capital[®] with more than 160 sun-soaked golf courses. Among these are The Palm Beach Par 3 Course, where the first nine holes lie on the Intracoastal Waterway and the back nine border the Atlantic Ocean, and Boca Raton's Red Reef Executive Golf Course with its water vistas. Players seeking a bigger challenge can tackle The Champion at the PGA National Resort & Spa or The Breakers' Ocean Course. Golfers who want to improve their game can visit the David Leadbetter Golf Academy, John Webster Golf Academy or John Prince Golf Learning Center.

Just west of The Palm Beaches is the Florida Everglades. Visitors can hop into an airboat for a thrilling tour of this natural treasure, zooming through the famed rivers of grass and stopping to observe alligators, ospreys and other wildlife. Other ecotourism delights include diving at Phil Foster Park, located under the Blue Heron Bridge, an estuary with vast marine life diversity, and a variety of nature reserves, such as Wakodahatchee Wetlands and Pondhawk Park, both of which offer many great birdwatching opportunities.
